



BEFORE CARE Lips

LIPS
BEFORE/AFTERCARE

If you have ever had a fever blister (EVER) in your life, you will need to see your doctor to get a prescription for Valtrex which you will take 1000mg for a total of 6 days, starting 2 days before procedure. This helps to prevent you from getting one after your lip procedure is done.

Day of procedure you will be swollen and color will be darker. You will want to have a generous amount of Vaseline or aquaphor on them at all times.

5 hours after procedure clean lips with sterile water and reapply ointment.

Avoid sodium foods and try to sleep propped up on back to lessen swelling the next day.

THE COLOR WILL APPEAR DARKER THE FIRST FEW DAYS!

Day 3-6 Your lips will start to feel chapped and peeling for a few days. **DO NOT PICK AT ANY OF THE SCABBING!**

Day 7-10 color may look like it's disappeared because at this stage the color will sometimes hide.

Days 10-30. Color will begin to come out throughout the first month of healing and by six weeks, you will see final result of color.

LONG TERM CARE FOR LIPS

Always use sunscreen even in winter to prevent fading. Avoid products that peel skin such as Retin-A directly on lips to prevent fading.
